About the project

Construction is underway on the Maple Street upgrade, with local Kuluin-based company, Disc Landscapes delivering the works.

You can still walk and drive along Maple Street, and access local businesses throughout construction.

These streetscape improvements will make it easier and safer to move along Maple Street.

Works include smoother and wider footpath sections, raised pedestrian crossings, improved lighting and new landscaping.

We will plant more than 1500 plants, trees and shrubs, along with adding seating and places to gather.

We'll continue to keep our community informed with regular updates as works progress.

The project is jointly funded by Sunshine Coast Council and the Queensland Government.

Construction activities

We're working in stages to minimise inconvenience to local businesses, residents and visitors. To improve pedestrian safety and connectivity during all works, the project's construction staging has been modified since our July project update.

Progress

The new raised pedestrian crossing 4 near the IGA (Zone 1, Area 1) is now complete and open to traffic. Temporary ramps and handrails are in place to enable pedestrians to use the new crossing safely while surrounding works continue.

Current and upcoming construction activities

Construction activities will increase in intensity over the coming weeks, with crews working in both Zone 1 and Zone 2 at the same time.

During these works, you may notice increased noise, vibration and dust at times.

Myrtle Street pedestrian crossing (Zone 2, Area 2)

Construction of the new pedestrian crossing near Myrtle Street (crossing 1) is progressing.

Footpath works (Zone 1, Area 2)

Crews have begun removing and rebuilding sections of footpath on the northern side of Maple Street, between numbers 40 and 44 Maple Street. This work is being done in preparation for the construction of crossing 3.

Footpath works (Zone 2, Area 2)

Footpath works will happen in stages along the western end of Maple Street, commencing in late August for approximately 8 weeks*.

New crossing near the chemist (Zone 1, Area 2)

Preparation for the construction of pedestrian crossing 3 near the chemist will start from **31 August 2026***.

Due to site constraints and Department of Transport and Main Roads requirements, there will be temporary changes to traffic flows. These include:

- Closure of the west-bound lane from Coral Street roundabout to Fig Street.

- A signed detour for west-bound traffic along Coral Street.
- Continued access to parking from the east-bound lane.
- Access to Teak Street, including the IGA car park and Mitre 10 will be available from the eastbound lane of Maple St only.
- Temporary changes to parking on the southern side of Maple Street, with vehicles required to nose-in and reverse-out of angled parking bays.



Temporary detour plan for west-bound traffic

This detour is expected to be in place for approximately 4 weeks*.

We suggest allowing extra time for your journey while these arrangements are in place as there may be short delays.

*Dates and durations are subject to weather and site conditions.

Temporary changes to pedestrian and vehicle traffic

You can still walk along Maple Street. Temporary footpath diversions will be in place when needed to keep everyone safe.

You can still drive along Maple Street. At times, sections of the road or on-street parking may be temporarily closed or subject to alternative arrangements.

There will be signage, traffic control and some temporary speed limits to help keep everyone safe.

Temporary changes to parking and loading

While work is underway, some parking spaces will be unavailable to help maintain traffic flow and provide a safe work area for the contractors. There may also be changes to how you use the parking, and there will be signage in place to guide you.

The loading bay which services the Community Centre and other nearby addresses will remain operational, however during the works to build crossing 3 it will be accessed from the east-bound lane only.

Waste collection

Waste bins can be left out for collection in their usual spot. The contractors are working with the waste collection service provider to maintain the same level of service. If there are any issues with bins not being emptied, please visit Council's website and search for 'waste bin collection'.

Health, safety and environmental

Please follow the signage and any diversions in place for pedestrians and vehicles to ensure your safety, and please follow the instructions given by the traffic controllers.

Safety, Environmental, and Erosion Sediment Control plans will be in place for the duration of the works.

Temporary traffic signage

The temporary traffic signs in place for the works are official traffic controls and are approved by the Department of Transport and Main Roads. We understand they can sometimes be inconvenient, however they play an important role in keeping road users, pedestrians and construction workers safe. Please do not move or remove any signage, bollards or barriers. Doing so is an offence under the Transport Operations (Road Use Management) Act 1995. If you do notice a sign that looks out of place, please let one of the contractors or traffic controllers know.

Hours of work

Construction will generally take place between 6am and 6pm. Night works are not expected at this stage.
