

Who was Mary Cairncross?

The name Mary Cairncross is a tribute to the memory of Mary Thynne, whose maiden name was Cairncross. Born in 1848, Mary Cairncross was a passionate environmentalist from an early age. She married Irish-born Andrew Joseph Thynne on 3 June 1869 in Brisbane. In 1902 Andrew Thynne purchased the Maleny land where the reserve is situated.

In October 1941, 100 acres was transferred through a Deed of Trust to the then Landsborough Shire Council by Mary's three daughters Elizabeth, Mabel and Mary Thynne. The agreement was conditional on the land being held as a reserve and sanctuary for the preservation, conservation and exhibition of the natural Flora and Fauna of the reserve, and that it should be known as The Mary Cairncross Scenic Reserve. By doing so, they were honouring their mother Mary Williamina Thynne, nee Cairncross.

This Deed of Trust has continued to be honoured by successive Councils - now the Sunshine Coast Regional Council.

The Thynne sisters could never have imagined what an incredible conservation legacy that they had provided. Without their foresight, this remarkable environmental reserve would not be enjoyed by the later generations as it is today.



Who are the Friends?

The Friends of Mary Cairncross Association is a charitable non-profit organisation that supports Sunshine Coast Regional Council in the management of Mary Cairncross Scenic Reserve - a significant eco island in Jinibara country.

The Association was the brainchild of Kate Thynne, wife of John Thynne and daughter of Kathleen McArthur the conservationist. Kate became an ardent advocate for the care and preservation of the Reserve. She founded the Mary Cairncross Association, which was later renamed as Friends of Mary Cairncross Association Inc.

What do we do?

The principal purpose of Friends is the protection and enhancement of the natural environment of the Reserve for all visitors to appreciate. To achieve this purpose, the Association promotes the natural beauty and ecological value of Mary Cairncross Scenic Reserve through the dissemination of information and the provision of education, and secondly, ensures the ecological integrity of the reserve is maintained through the facilitation of research and monitoring. In partnership with the Sunshine Coast Regional Council, Friends have funded projects at the Reserve such as:

- The After Dark display, and signage for the Birdwing Butterfly area and for prominent trees throughout the reserve
- The publication of 2 books: "The Magic of Mary Cairncross" and "Birds of Mary Cairncross"
- Project celebrating the contribution of volunteers: "The People of Mary"
- Undertaking flora and fauna surveys and commissioning a fungi survey in the Reserve
- Acquiring audio research equipment to record the Coxen's Fig Parrot
- Supporting volunteers through the provision of jackets and laser pointers for guides
- Supporting Honours scholarships at the University of the Sunshine Coast.

"A remnant of subtropical rain forest - a living museum of plant and animal life – that is the Mary Cairncross Scenic Reserve."



How do we fundraise?

The sale of promotional and educational items in the retail section of the Discovery Centre is the main source of income for the Friends. For larger projects, the Friends apply for Grants through various environmental and governmental organisations. Memberships, bequests and donations help us to meet our objectives. All funds raised go directly back into the protection and enhancement of the natural environment of the Reserve.
