

Mooloolaba Foreshore Revitalisation



July update

Stage Two of the Mooloolaba Foreshore Revitalisation project continues with more beachfront parkland, new community facilities and improved accessibility on its way.

We're pleased to share the new coastal pathway in front of the Surf Club is now open, just in time for the June-July Queensland school holidays.

You'll notice pathway lighting, a newly opened four metre-wide path, refreshed landscaping and reinstated timber seating in front of the Surf Club. New turf is also in place and will be opened once it's established.

While we're excited to welcome you back for beachfront strolls, please be mindful that works continue on the foreshore upgrade. We'll be opening the first section of the terraced seawall very soon.



Construction works

Construction activity continues across multiple locations of the site, including a dedicated subcontractor building the new public toilets, showers and Changing Places facility.

The concrete floor slabs for new public amenities have been completed ([images below](#)), along with some more landscaping works and preparation works for the upcoming road realignment.

The beach remains open in front of the site for our community's enjoyment.

Major construction remains on track for anticipated project completion in early 2027 (March), weather and site conditions permitting.

Next month's works (July)

- Continued construction of the terraced seawall from north of the Surf Club including under the future ocean viewing deck
- Installation of trees and gardens in seawall planters near the Surf Club
- Final vapour blasting and sealing of the first section of terraced seawall
- Removal of construction access track on beach in front of Surf Club
- Preparatory works for the upcoming road realignment in front of the Peninsular Building including underground services works.

June works included:

- Continued construction of the terraced seawall
- Completion of pathway concrete pours, turf and garden installation in front of the Surf Club ([image below](#))
- Transplanted Pandanus at top of seawall near Surf Club
- Seawall surface works (vapour blasting and sealing) in the first section of terrace seawall
- Removal of existing pavers within the road alignment area
- Preparatory works for upcoming road realignment in front of Peninsular Building including underground services
- Completion of concrete floor slabs for the new public amenities.
