Construction overview

Despite the Sunshine Coast experiencing some rainy weather over the Christmas and New Year holiday season, it was great to see so many residents and visitors enjoying the newly opened viewing platform, boardwalk and open turfed areas.

Stage 1, Zone B construction recommenced on Monday 10 January 2022.

While the prolonged wet weather and impacts of the pandemic continue to create some challenges regarding the availability of materials and staff, Stage 1 works are expected to be complete by April 2022.

We will share more information with you about the planned Stage 1 Opening celebrations over the coming months.

Adventure Playground update

The new adventure playground located at the southern section of Stage 1 (between the new sheltered barbecue area and coastal pathway) is an outcome of community consultation from the [2015 Place Making Mooloolaba Master Plan](#).

This interactive and fun play space has been designed for children of all ages and is the first of its kind in the southern hemisphere. It features three main play elements including a climbing net, an adventure play tower and an extended swing set.

In consideration of nearby residents and businesses, the playground has been designed to fit within the natural terrain of the site.

At its highest point the linear climbing net will be approximately 3.5 metres from the lower park level (below the road level) with four poles protruding through it. Refer sketch at right.

Shade sails will be installed over the remaining play elements which will be located behind the existing embankment and vegetation.

With this area previously inaccessible to the general public, this new community space will provide hours of family fun, be a major drawcard to Mooloolaba and a key economic driver for local businesses.




Figure 2 Artist impression – new Adventure Playground
