Sugar Road and Maud Street Transport Corridor Upgrade Community update

First stage of interim works – complete

Council has now completed the first stage of interim works, namely line marking changes, on Sugar Road, between Oloway Crescent and the Sugar Road-Wises Roads roundabout.

We thank our community for your cooperation during these recent night works.

Changed traffic and parking conditions

Changed traffic and parking rules are now in place on Sugar Road, between the Sugar-Wises Roads roundabout and Olaway Crescent intersection, north and southbound.

Please observe the road rules and new signage in place including:

- Left-in, left-out only turning movements for north and south bound travel (i.e.: no turning across the double white line). U-Turns for right turn movements can be made at the Sugar-Wises Roads roundabout and Dalton Drive-Sugar Road roundabout.
- No on-street parking at any time
- No stopping or unloading of vehicles of any kind, at any time.

For our community's safety, Queensland Police and Council officers patrol various locations across the region to enforce traffic and parking regulations. In accordance with state legislation and local laws, infringements are issued for non-compliance.

Please advise your family, friends, staff and suppliers of the new traffic and parking conditions.

Second stage of Sugar Road interim works – to be confirmed

The next stage of Sugar Road interim works include footpath and cycle ramp works. These works are expected to take place before the end of this financial year (prior to June 2026).
