Changes to traffic conditions for Mooloolaba Triathlon Saturday 13 March and Sunday 14 March 2021 Walan Street and Smith Street, Mooloolaba

This is a courtesy notice ahead of the temporary changes to traffic conditions required to safely conduct the Mooloolaba Triathlon.

While the traffic changes are not construction related and are implemented by the event organisers (IRONMAN), the Queensland Police Service, the Department of Transport and Main Roads and Council have approved the changes for the event.

Signage and traffic controllers will be present.

Access to the ParknGo Mooloolaba Central car park during the event:

For motorists travelling north from Brisbane Road. Turn left into Walan Street, take the temporary U-Turn at the Naroo Court intersection, turn left into Smith Street and enter the ParknGo Mooloolaba Central car park.

For motorists travelling south from Mooloolaba Esplanade. The southern entry to Walan Street, near Venning Street will be closed. Please follow the northbound instructions as above.

Access to Smith Street and Muraban Street during the event:

During the event, the southbound entry to Walan Street, near Venning Street will be closed to all through-traffic.

Residents and businesses are advised to take the northern route from Brisbane Road, turn left into Walan Street, take the temporary U-Turn at the Naroo Court intersection, then turn left into Smith Street to access other streets.
