Sugar Road and Maud Street Transport Corridor Upgrade

Project overview

As Maroochydore continues to grow, more residents and visitors are travelling to and from the heart of the Sunshine Coast by car, on foot, by bike and by bus.

Sugar Road and Maud Street are key travel routes, particularly to and from the CBD. The area has a history of crashes, lacks connected paths for people walking or riding and experiences traffic congestion for motorists and public transport users.

Sunshine Coast Council is planning to make this travel corridor safer and more efficient for all users.

Sugar Road and Maud Street, from Bungama Street to Wises Road, will be upgraded across multiple stages. The project upgrade benefits include:

- new, separated pathways for walking and riding to reduce conflict with vehicle traffic
- new signalised and raised priority crossings at key intersections to make it safer for people to cross these busy roads
- widening Sugar Road and Maud Street from two to four lanes to increase traffic capacity, improve traffic flow, reduce 'short-cutting' in nearby side streets and address safety concerns

- making the area greener and more comfortable and enjoyable for walking and riding with new planted verges, trees, landscaped garden beds and shaded pathways
- providing a transport corridor that supports a vibrant, connected and future-ready Maroochydore.

The project's sequence of stages and construction timing will be subject to future budget considerations.

Interim upgrade works - Sugar Road

While Council continues detailed design for the Maud Street upgrades, some interim works will progress on Sugar Road, between Oloway Crescent and the Sugar Road-Wises Roads roundabout.

Works will take place from December 2025 to early 2026 and include line marking changes, minor footpath improvements, new cycle ramps and improvements to cycle lanes. These upgrades will help improve traffic flow and safety in the shorter term, ahead of the longer-term stages for the transport corridor.

It will help future proof the area by reducing traffic congestion, increasing public transport efficiency and improving walking and riding options.

Permanent changes to line marking, traffic and parking conditions

One of the key contributors to traffic congestion in the current single lane arrangement on Sugar Road is vehicle queuing. Vehicles must stop and wait for other vehicles to turn across the single centre line, into homes and businesses.

This in turn contributes to crashes and congestion along Sugar Road and the Sugar-Wises Roads roundabout.

To improve traffic and safety conditions in the shortmedium term, and ahead of the project's permanent upgrades, interim changes will be made to the section of Sugar Road between Oloway Crescent and Sugar-Wises Roads roundabout.

These interim works include:

 a new, double centre line (replacing the current single centre line). The double centre line will mean left-in, left-out only turning movements will be legal in this section of Sugar Road for north and south bound travel. U-Turns for right turn movements can be made at the Sugar-Wises Roads roundabout and Dalton Drive-Sugar Road roundabout.

Travelling northbound (toward the CBD):

- extending the length of two departure lanes leaving the Wises Road Roundabout along Sugar Road and moving the merge to a single northbound lane closer to Oloway Crescent
- removing on-street parking between the Sugar-Wises Roads roundabout and Oloway Crescent intersection, to accommodate the additional traffic lane and installation of yellow bicycle awareness symbols.

Travelling southbound (toward the Sugar-Wises Roads roundabout):

a new dedicated cycle lane

 the removal of on-street parking between the Oloway Crescent intersection and Sugar-Wises Roads roundabout, to accommodate the traffic lane and new cycle lane.

Timing of interim works (night works) Wednesday 10 to Monday 15 December, 2025

To reduce inconvenience to our community, including Sugar Road businesses, the line marking changes to accommodate the road, departure lane extension, cycle lane and parking changes will be undertaken at night.

Two-way traffic will continue, with traffic control in operation. Access will remain to homes and businesses.

Early 2026- Footpath and riding/cycle ramp works Exact dates and times TBC

Cycle ramp and pathway improvements will be undertaken in early 2026. We will advise our community of these works in a future update.




Figure 2: Interim works detail - including changes to line marking and traffic and parking conditions
