INTRODUCTION

CRUMMUNDA PARK is a popular 2.4 hectare linear park located on the Wurtulla side of the Wurtulla and Currimundi suburb border and forms part of northern bank of Currimundi Lake.

The park is named after one of the variations to the aborigional name for the area 'Garamandha' or place of the flying fox.

Surveyor Burnett officially recorded the name of the area as

Crummunda in 1845. The area has had many uses since eurpean settlement including in early 1939 parts of Currimundi and

Wurtulla area gazetted for military training.

At the conclusion of the end of World War II, the area became popular with tourist and residients seeking a sea change. Today, Crummunda Park is a popular location for residents and visitors to visit due to its relaxed, shady and natural look and feel.

CRUMMUNDA PARK LANDSCAPE PLAN

The purpose of this Landscape Plan is to define the future planning blueprint for the park whilst maintaining the relaxed and natural aesthetic valued by its visitors. The plan draws inspiration from the community consultation results and the current Sunshine Coast Councils Policies & Strategies.

The Landscape Plan is to be delivered through a staged process of priority works subject to council's budget approval process. It is intended that park infrastructure is to be replaced once it reaches its end of life to promote a sustainable upgrade of the park.

As a park, the Crummunda Park Landscape Plan is primarily directed by the preferred strategic outcomes described in the Open Space Strategy (2011).

ECONOMIC ADVANTAGE

The strategy designates that open space has the capacity to support a diverse range of complementary industries that contribute to the Sunshine Coast economy based on our natural advantage. By redefining and improving the celebration and open space in the park, existing events can be better catered for and expanded improving its appeal as a destination.

STRONG COMMUNITY IDENTITY, INVOLVEMENT AND PARTNERSHIP

The strategy actively encourages the development of parks and reserves that are vibrant, diverse and creative settings with a strong sense of place and strengthen community identity. The Landscape Plan looks to reinforce the local community's connection to the park by designing infrastructure upgrades that promote family and community gathering and promote existing and future partnership with local community groups such as the one that exists with the Currimundi Catchment Care Group and Lake Currimundi-Kawana Lions Club.

ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION

The strategy acknowledges the important role parks play in maintaining and improving the biodiversity, enhancing amenity and user comfort of public areas. Through the provision of clear direction for the land use in Crummunda Park, the Landscape Plan will become the avenue in which our natural environment is maintained via the protection of existing trees and supplimentary planting where required.

WELL CONNECTED COMMUNITIES

Developing public spaces that are well connected through the provision of linked trails, community hubs and parks and reserves is a key outcome of the strategy. The improved pedestrian and cycle links proposed in the Landscape Plan will develop better links to surrounding residents as well as make the park more accessible to a wider variety of users in particular visitors with mobility difficulties.

AFFORDABLE AND RESPONSIVE MANAGEMENT

The open space strategy strongly encourages sound investment in design that delivers standards of service that are responsive to the communities values and changing needs. The proposed park layout addresses ever increasing demand on the park by actively seeking to reclaim open space, reducing maintenance requirements through design outcomes and infrastructure selection, which in tern reduces running cost of the park.

District parks

PERFORMANCE CRITERIA

Designated as a district park the primary use is for recreation, social, cultural and leisure activities and provides complimentary values of landscape amenity and biodiversity conservation. As district recreation park Crummunda Park is able to provide a more diverse range of nature based recreation opportunities and experiences that may encourage longer stays.

EMBELLISHMENTS

After extensive community consultation and Sunshine Coast Council internal consultation the following embellishments have been selected to be incorporated within the park.

These embellishments are inline with the accepted level of embellishment outlined in the Open Space Strategy:

Weed free, tree plating, signage, interpretive signage, vehicle
access (emergency vehicles), public art, car parking (on
site), vehicle barriers, bicycle racks, footpath/ bike way, flat
well drained play area, bench seating, picnic tables/ shelters,
barbecues, toilets, play spaces/ youth/ fitness equipment,
lighting/ security lighting, water access/ ramp jetty, landscape/
gardens, rubbish bins, drainage and fencing.

The Landscape Plan refers to infrastructure upgrades preferred by the Opens Space Landscape Infrastructure Manual (LIM). The nominated infrastructure in this plan has been selected to be sustainable, accessible and durable as well as complementary to the natural landscape.



)BJECTIVES:

Maintain existing toilet block Improve lighting and sight lines around toilet block to align with Crime Prevention Through Environmental Design (CPTED) principles

- Upgrade existing BBQ facilities from single to double units to increase capacity
- Locate picnic settings under existing shade trees
- Upgrade picnic setting to aluminium to decrease maintenance
- Include DDA compliant seating in areas adjacent to disabled car parks

PICNIC SHELTERS

 Upgrade picnic shelters with skillin roof structures to minimise visual impact on adjacent residents and increase capacity

PLAYGROUNDS

- Upgrade play equipment to allow for use by a variet of different ages and abilities
- Condense playgrounds into one location
- Install park seating around playgrounds

PLANTING

- · Remove weed species
- Revegetate lake edge similar to what originally existed to assist in bank stabilisation

LAKE ACCESS

 Improve river access points for swimming and non motorised water craft to reduce bank erosion

Pinch points and specialised surface treatments to protect tree roots may be required where significant conflicts exist. Council's arborist are to be consulted in the planning and desing phase prior to construction.

2. Areas with Disability Discrimination Act (1992) compliant (DDA) access are to use equal access picnic tables and chairs.


