

## Pet Ownership

Owning a new pet is a very exciting time for the whole family. It also comes with responsibility to ensure your pets are kept safe and don't cause a nuisance to others.

### Top Tips for pet owners

- Pets must be registered once they reach 12 weeks of age
- Microchip your pet. If they are lost or stolen you are more likely to find them because the chip includes your contact details and provides proof of ownership.
- De-sex your dog and cat to avoid unwanted litters.
- Provide a suitable enclosure to make sure your pets stay in your yard or home.
- Pick up and dispose of your dog's faeces at home and in public areas.
- Socialise and train your dog. This will reduce unwanted behaviours such as excessive barking and digging.

### Infringements

Fines may be issued if your dog is unregistered or off-leash in an area where leashes are required.

If you receive an infringement notice, please read the back of the notice for details on how to pay the fine.

Council's contact details are at the end of this fact sheet if you need assistance paying your infringement.



### Registration and microchipping

Dogs and cats must be registered when they reach 12 weeks of age. Registration is free for pets under six months of age.

An annual registration fee is due each year on September 30. A discount applies to all pets that are de-sexed and microchipped.

If you sell or give-away a dog or cat, you must change the details on the microchip registration prior to changing ownership i.e. owner, address, and phone number.

### Where can I register my pet?

- Visit a council office between 8.30am 4.30pm, Monday to Friday

### Lost pets

In the first instance, Council officers will return lost dogs and cats to their owners if the owner can be identified by the pet's registration tag or microchip.

If Council is unable to identify the animal or if the owner is not at home, the animal will be cared for at the Sunshine Coast Animal Pound at Sippy Downs

A fee is required to retrieve an animal from the pound.
