# Stage Two Summer 2025-26 at Mooloolaba

2 December 2025

The Mooloolaba Christmas Tree is up, school holidays are almost here and Mooloolaba is ready to welcome locals and visitors for another peak Summer season.

The foreshore revitalisation project continues with more beachfront parkland, new community facilities and improved accessibility on its way.

Here's what to expect on site during December 2025 and January 2026.

## What to expect for construction

#### Construction site and fencing

For our community's safety the current foreshore and beach fenced off construction area will remain in place over Summer with current access to the beach and businesses remaining.

#### Construction shutdown

From Saturday 20 December to Sunday 11 January (inclusive) all construction activity will pause. Where possible most machinery and materials will be moved to the Brisbane Road compound site during the shutdown period.

Some construction machinery must remain on site for emergency use if required. This may include mobilising equipment in the case of severe weather impacts or disaster management purposes.

Construction activity will restart from Monday 12 January, from 6am to 5pm, Monday to Friday. Please refer to the image on page three.

### **Access open**

#### Mooloolaba Beach OPEN

More than 1km of your favourite beach is open with the surf lifesaver patrolled swimming area operating south of the surf club.

#### Access to businesses and hotels OPEN

Vehicle and pedestrian access remain to Mooloolaba Esplanade, local businesses, restaurants, cafes and hotels.

#### **Undercover parking**

During Stage Two construction, the first four hours of parking are FREE at the PARKnGO Mooloolaba Central car park (with the exception of the NYE special event parking - read further below).

More than 700 parking spaces (including accessible parking spaces), 54 motorcycle spaces and 50 bicycle spaces are available.

#### Public toilets and showers

While the new public amenities are being built, you can find temporary amenities (showers and toilets) at Beach Terrace and Arthur Parkyn Park.

# See 2025 out and 2026 in with a double bang!

This year Mooloolaba Esplanade is the place to be to welcome in 2026 with two FREE family-friendly fireworks events at 8.30pm AND midnight.

The Mooloolaba displays will be launched from an offshore barge, ensuring spectacular views from Alexandra Headland to Point Cartwright.

While foreshore revitalisation works continue, we are encouraging locals and visitors to enjoy the displays from multiple viewing points — including along the Esplanade at local restaurants and cafes, and from nearby beaches and parks.

#### **Getting to Mooloolaba**

For those visiting the area, there's 50-cent public bus fares and Council's supervised ThinkChange
BikePark on Mooloolaba Esplanade (opposite Meta
Street) to park your bike or scooter for FREE and help reduce congestion.

Special event parking is available at PARKnGO Mooloolaba Central for a flat rate of \$10, valid from 2pm on New Year's Eve until 2am. This rate is payable on entry. After 2am, standard parking rates will apply, including the first four hours free. This allows special event parkers to leave by 2am at no extra cost.

#### **Payment information**

Portable EFTPOS terminals will be available at the car park entry. Friendly parking attendants will be onsite from 2pm to 2am to assist with smooth entry and exit.

#### Important note

Pre-booking is not available for this event. Parking is offered on a first-come, first served basis.
