March update

Stage Two of the Mooloolaba foreshore revitalisation project continues with more beachfront parkland, new community facilities and improved accessibility on its way.

Here's a look at what's been happening on site and what's coming next.

Completed February works

- Ongoing demolition of the existing seawall – moving from the Surf Club, northwards
- Ongoing seawall foundation piling
- Ongoing shaping and preparation of embankment ready for seawall terraces
- Construction of new seawall terraces in front of Surf Club
- Sewer utility works by Unitywater.

This month's activity

- Ongoing seawall foundation piling leading to the completion of 550 piles installed
- Ongoing shaping and preparation of embankment ready for seawall terraces
- Construction of new seawall terraces in front of Surf Club (image below showing the latest terrace steps taking shape)
- Underground services installation (electrical and water)
- Construction of seating in front of Surf Club.



Looking ahead

March will mark a huge achievement for the project with the final underground foundation piles being installed towards the end of this month.

A total of 550 piles, will form the deep structural footing of the terraced seawall that will help to protect Mooloolaba from intense coastal conditions and double as ocean front seating for our community

This month and next month (April) will see construction activity taking place in different locations simultaneously throughout the construction site. We will continue to keep our community informed.

Council's ThinkChange program will run a FREE BikePark service at Charles Clarke Park, offering secure bike and scooter parking:

- Saturday: 5am – 1pm
- Sunday: 5am – 3.30pm
