A note from your local councillor - Cr Maria Suarez

I'm excited to share some of the key highlights from this year's budget for Division 9.

You'll see projects that make everyday life easier and safer, alongside long-term infrastructure that shapes how our community moves and grows into the future.

I'm proud to share the Sunshine Coast Mountain Bike Centre project in Maroochy River is set to start in 2027, with year-one funding allocated by the State and Federal Governments.

A \$5 million investment from State Government, with additional Council funding will enable Stage 1 delivery of the Coolum District Sports Ground. This will support our rapidly growing AFL and netball clubs and strengthen grass roots participation.

We're investigating the feasibility of multi-use half-court basketball and pickleball courts at Peregian Breeze and Kingfisher Park to create flexible spaces that cater to a wide range of users.

Our natural areas receive a boost with a renewal of the visitor and information centre at the Maroochy Wetlands Sanctuary, and a disability-compliant access ramp at Tickle Park, to make beach access much easier for everyone.

With safety a key priority, we're adding pathways across Division 9 and extending the existing solar bollard lighting at Havana Rd E, making journeys between Coolum Beach and Peregian Springs safer when the sun goes down.
