

Mooloolaba Foreshore Revitalisation



August update

29 July 2026

Stage Two of the Mooloolaba Foreshore Revitalisation project continues with more beachfront parkland, new community facilities and improved accessibility on its way.

Work has been progressing on the Central Meeting Place with more of the parkland elements starting to take shape.

With sunny skies finally here and the finishing works able to be completed, we're also very close to opening the first section of terraced seawall in front of the Surf Club in early August. Watch this space!

Foreshore construction works

Construction activity continues across multiple locations of the site and as works progress, more sections of the foreshore will reopen.

This includes additional seawall terraces with more trees and vegetation for shade, beach access points, new public amenities and coastal pathways, transforming the area into a more accessible, resilient and welcoming beachfront destination.

The beach remains open in front of the site for our community's enjoyment.

Major construction remains on track for anticipated project completion in early 2027 (March), weather and site conditions permitting.

This month's works completed (July)

- Continued construction of the terraced seawall and all abilities beach ramp
- Installation of trees and plants in sections of the seawall
- Vapour blasting and sealing of the first section of the terraced seawall
- Concrete works of road realignment in front of the Peninsular Building including underground services works.
- Electrical works
- Amenities building works.



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Next month's works (August)

- Finishing touches to the seawall in front of the Surf Club including removal of the construction access track, rocks and any other debris, and reinstatement of sand over the lower terraces
- Continued construction of the remainder of the terraced seawall, north of the Surf Club
- Continued construction of the all abilities beach access ramp
- Concrete works for the upcoming road realignment and pedestrian crossing in front of the Peninsular Building including underground services works
- Preparatory works for the ocean viewing deck
- Continuation of underground electrical works.

Sunshine Coast Marathon

The Sunshine Coast Marathon will take place on Sunday 2 August, and we extend a warm welcome to more than 16,000 runners plus their supporters and visitors joining us for the event.

Some roads in Mooloolaba will be temporarily affected early in the morning (4am-9am), including Mooloolaba Esplanade, Venning Street, Walan Street and Brisbane Road.

There is still plenty of time for breakfast, brunch or lunch in Mooloolaba.

A section of the Sunshine Motorway (southbound lanes only) from Twin Waters to Maroochydore will also be affected from 5am-11am.

The Sunshine Coast Airport is fully accessible via the usual Mudjimba exits in both directions - still allow for extra travel time.



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Secure your BikePark

Participants, spectators and workers are encouraged to take advantage of the Bike Park set up in Alexandra Headland. The BikePark offers FREE secure bike parking so you can lock up with confidence and enjoy the event.

Ride, park, and head straight to the start line or cheer zone on the corner of Okinja Road and Alexandra Parade.
