On average a cat stays in the pound for 6 days (including weekends and public holidays), this costs council approximately \$390 per cat. Where a cat is rehomed or euthanised none of this cost is redeemed through impound or sustenance fees. In 2013 there were 446 cats impounded, only 63 were returned to their owner. This represents an estimated cost of \$149,370

In addition to the above information, data collected since August 2013 suggests that:

- 93% of cats which were impounded are not registered
- 97% of cats which were impounded are not desexed
- 81% of cats which were impounded are not microchipped
