

COUNCILLOR COMMENT

The recent motorbike accident in the Kenilworth area has once again highlighted the significant lack of mobile phone coverage in the Sunshine Coast hinterland. Residents and visitors have for a long time identified mobile phone coverage as a major issue impacting during times of disaster and when accidents occur. Roads with traffic volumes and increasing numbers of visitors to these areas should not be deprived of what is now considered basic levels of communications infrastructure and needs to be addressed immediately.

The farmers who run businesses in the area, trail bike riders, campers, visitors to the Big Egg, and residents who are isolated during times of flooding are all impacted by the lack of mobile broadband communications.
