I hereby notify of my intention to move the following motion at the Ordinary Meeting to take place on Thursday 23, March 2017:

That Council authorise the Chief Executive Officer to undertake a trial regarding the provision of residential parking permits for residents within the Birtinya Regulated Parking Area (as per Map SLL5.3.1 in Subordinate Local Law No. 5 (Parking) 2011), in an effort to understand the potential implications associated with overflow parking in the residential streets following the opening of the new Sunshine Coast University Public Hospital and that the trial include the following:

- a) residents being able to apply for up to two (2) parking permits which allows for any vehicle to overstay the one (1) hour time restriction within the Birtinya Regulated Parking Area; and
- b) that residents be exempt from paying application fees for the duration of the trial (until 31 July 2018); and
- c) that residents are responsible for each permit issued and any lost or damaged permit requiring replacement during the trial being subject to a replacement fee as per Council's adopted fees and charges at the time.

### **COUNCILLOR COMMENT**

The new Sunshine Coast University Public Hospital commenced a graduated opening on Monday, 6 March 2017, with all additional services opening by 4 April 2017.

Residents residing within the Birtinya Regulated Parking Area have raised concerns that the hospital opening will result in overflow parking in the residential streets, therefore preventing residents, visitors and service providers from having access to on-street parking.

In an effort to understand the potential implications and possible issues associated with overflow parking in this area as a result of the new hospital opening, it is proposed that a trial involving the provision of residential parking permits be undertaken until 31 July 2018, which includes the following:

- provision of up to two (2) parking permits per property allowing a vehicle to overstay the one (1) hour time restriction within the Birtinya Regulated Parking Area; and
- residents being exempt from application fees for the duration of the trial (until 31 July 2018); and
- residents paying replacement fees as per Council's adopted fees and charges should any permit become lost or damaged.
