As part of Domestic and Family Violence Protection Month, more than 300 people gathered on 5 May 2021 to pay their respects and show support to victims of domestic and family violence in a moving candlelight vigil and community march in Maroochydore. A range of new classes and locations were added to the free and low cost Healthy Sunshine Coast program, including new and expanded group and aquatic fitness, yoga, Pilates, Tai Chi and community dance activities. The fourth and final round of The Lift Project health and wellbeing program was released in May 2021. With almost 6000 registrations in the program over the course of four rounds, the program has been a resounding success to help the community improve their overall health and wellbeing.
