Student successes

- Chancellor State College's RoboGEMS team won the 2017 Queensland State FIRST LEGO League (FLL) Competition for their Kitchen Top Helper, an autonomous irrigation system that could be used as a household counter top herb garden.
- RoboGEMS member Sarah Eisenmenger returned from the Girls in STEM Power camp in Brisbane as the 2018 female STEM ambassador.
- RoboGEMS won the 2018 Mayor's Telstra Technology Awards with their Kitchen Top Helper. RoboKings from Chancellor State College placed second with their design Deuce, an automatic tennis partner, and third place was awarded to Growing Smart from Mountain Creek State High School with their farm land irrigation system.
- RoboKings have won the National Robotics Title two years in a row and were world champions at the First Lego League Razorback Invitational in 2017.
- In 2018, RoboGEMS teamed-up with male students to create RoboRoyals who won the Queensland FLL titles followed by the Australian National FLL Robotics Championships.
- Ray Steele from Nambour State College, a finalist in the 2018 Mayor's Telstra Technology Awards, won the 2018 Generation Innovation challenge with his Driving Mate concept which offers incentives for people to put their phone away behind the wheel.
