Environment Levy Partnerships Overview

- Environment Levy (EL) Partnerships program one of three components in the EL Partnerships and Grants Program, with the other two being EL Grants and EL Landholder Environment Grants.
- Fully funded from the Environment Levy.
- Program managed by Environmental Operations and administered by Community Connections.



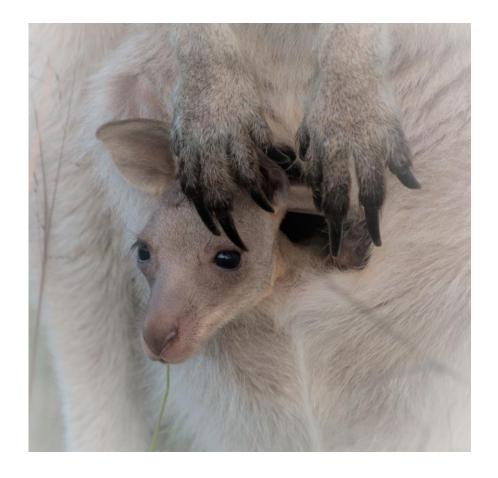
Environment Levy Partnerships 2021/22 Summary

- EL Partnerships application/acquittal process:
 - Expression of Interest (EOI)
 - discussions with Env Ops staff and applicant organisation
 - submission of application
 - panel assessment,
 - senior manager independent review of applications, and
 - acquittal process that allows collection of data to quantify benefits to Council and broader community.
- 19 new applications recommended total value of \$610,000.
- 18 previous partners, 1 new partner.



Environment Levy Partnerships 2021/22 Overview of 19 partnerships

- 18 of the applicant organisations have previously been in the partnership program
- 1 new group, Wildcare Qld, requested funds to assist with operational costs associated with wildlife rescues.
- In 2019/20, partner groups contributed
 - 3,733 volunteers
 - 415,172 volunteer hours = \$12.45m



Examples of Environment Benefits

- In 2019/20, Coolum & North Shore Coast Care working at 11 sites have planted 1,700 native plants and removed 1,557 bags of weeds in addition to large number of environmental weeds managed in situ.
- Over last 3 years our 5 community nurseries have supplied 92,350 native plants to 300+ LFW properties.
- Australia Zoo Wildlife Hospital treated 9,562 admissions in 2019/20, approx. 50% from Sunshine Coast Local Government Area.
- GMAN established and manage koala food plantation at Pinelands Park in partnership with Environmental Operations and Parks & Gardens.
