Caloundra Headland Coastal Pathway - Boardwalk

February update

- Construction activity and temporary road closure to vehicles (day and night)
- Road closure Monday 29 January to Thursday 28 March inclusive (weather permitting)
- The Esplanade section between Albert Street and Margaret Street
- Detours in place. Pedestrian and traffic control in place. Construction crew and machinery on site and roadway.

Construction overview

Construction is continuing on the new 160 metre long section of Caloundra Headland Coastal Pathway Boardwalk. This section forms part of a total 73 kilometre long coastal pathway route from Bells Creek in the south to Coolum in the north.

For safety reasons during construction temporary changes to traffic conditions are required. This also allows the construction team to work more efficiently and reduce the construction duration, thereby minimising inconvenience to residents and visitors.

Construction activity

February activity will see the continued construction of the boardwalk. This will include supports and decking and the installation of timber and stainless steel balustrading, electrical cabling and pathway lights.

Intermittent medium level noise can be expected during the day. Large machinery will be in place onsite and working from the roadway.

Temporary changes to traffic conditions – road closure

To ensure the safety of our community, including construction workers, a temporary road closure is required.

This temporary closure has been timed to avoid the peak holiday season and will be in place as follows:

Monday 29 January to Thursday 28 March (inclusive) day and night. Section of the Esplanade between Albert and Margaret Streets

This section of the Esplanade will be temporarily closed to all vehicle traffic during the day and night. Detours will be in place via Burgess, Margaret and Albert Streets with signage erected to help redirect motorists.

Pedestrians and cyclists will be detoured around the site via alternative pathways.

Boat ramp access

Access to the boat ramp will remain available for much of the construction period. In the case of any temporary changes to boat ramp access, signage will be in place with mariners redirected to alternative ramp locations.
