## Introduction

- Council must consider and resolve the application of National Competition Policy (NCP) on an annual basis.
- The purpose of this report is to make recommendations on the application of National Competition Policy reforms for the 2021/2022 financial year to:
  - off-street parking
  - o festivals.



# National Competition Policy legislative regime at a glance

If Council undertakes <u>significant business activity</u> it must apply the <u>competitive neutrality principle</u> to reform that activity unless a <u>public</u> <u>benefit assessment</u> shows that the benefit of applying competitive neutrality will not outweigh the costs of doing so.

Council must consider whether or not to apply the <u>code of competitive</u> <u>conduct</u> to its other <u>business activities</u> (which are not significant business activities) which meet a prescribed expenditure threshold.

## Off-Street Parking

ParknGo at Mooloolaba Central & future paid parking in Maroochydore City Centre

Business Activity? Yes. Council is trading in commercial parking services that are delivered to the public through agreements with parking management companies. Council controls the prices at which the services are supplied.

Prescribed Business Activity? Yes. Expenditure is above the \$340,000 threshold.
