Pathway Improvements - Buderim Street, Currimundi

Project summary

Sunshine Coast Council is committed to improving and maintaining pathway networks across our region.

In partnership with the Queensland Government, Council will be widening footpaths around Currimundi State School and Currimundi Special School.

The existing 1.2m wide footpath will be widened to 2-2.5 metres to allow for the growing volume of pathway users.

Works will be undertaken during the school holidays in two sections:

- Eastern section 2m wide path constructed from the main school entrance to the coastal pathway.
- Western section 2 to 2.5m wide path constructed from the signalised crossing at the school to the Currimundi Hotel.

See figure 1 overleaf for location of works.

The project will result in the removal of seven trees and one parking space to improve safety and connectivity for all users. Council will be planting 20 trees to offset those removed.

Start date

Work is scheduled to be completed in two phases. The Western section on the South side of Buderim Street will be constructed from 11-21 December 2023, weather permitting.

The Eastern section (towards the beach) will be constructed from 8-19 January 2024, weather permitting.

Property access

Construction crews will contact residents prior to starting any works which may affect property access.

Traffic management

Traffic management measures will be in place throughout construction to ensure the safety of all road users. Your patience during construction is appreciated.
