




Curator's foreward

Hello and welcome to the third instalment of our biennial Collection feature show: Latest & Greatest III. This special exhibition is a considered selection of the latest acquisitions that aims to shine a spotlight on the growth of the Sunshine Coast Art Collection from 1 January 2023 to 31 December 2024. It is an opportunity to reflect on the Collection's evolution and its contribution to the Sunshine Coast's vibrant arts and cultural identity.

This two-year snapshot demonstrates how the Collection has continued its mission to grow as a valuable cultural asset for the Sunshine Coast. Through acquisitive art awards, commissioned works, generous donations and Cultural Gifts, the Collection boasts a dynamic and diverse array of artworks in its holdings. To illustrate the extent of generosity by donors, one example included a significant collection of 70 works by renowned Australian abstract artist, David Rankin, along with a unique suite of nine editioned signed silkscreen prints by Sidney Nolan (1917 – 92)!

Council's vision to foster a region that is healthy, smart, and creative, recognises that creativity expands perspectives, fosters innovative thinking, and strengthens resilience. The Collection embodies these ideals through region-wide displays, art in public spaces and curated exhibitions that amplify creative voices and celebrate diverse artistic expressions. In contributing to achieving Council's Creative Arts Plan 2023-2038 goals, the Collection celebrates First Nations creativity and expression, builds capacity through art collections management development (internships) and public art commissions, through to cultivating the region's identity by building recognition for visual arts on the Sunshine Coast.

The Sunshine Coast Art Collection continues to strengthen its holdings in the key areas of public art and two-dimensional and three-dimensional contemporary works, as well as new explorations into digital and time-based media.

For example:

- Landmark commissions, including the First
 Nations public artwork, *Dura Gunga*, as a Kabi
 Kabi welcome at the entrance of the Sunshine
 Coast City Hall and *Chorus* by James and
 Eleanor Avery, commissioned by Stockland
 in partnership with Council.
- Expansion of First Nations artworks in the Collection's holdings by collaborative commissions with business units within Council.
- Groundbreaking acquisitions in the digital medium such as our first time-based art prizewinning work: No use crying over ripped lace, by Todd Fuller, and a digital soundscape through the Australian Government's Cultural Gifts Program, by internationally renowned local composer, Tyson Illingworth.

These achievements reflect our commitment to the Creative Arts Plan 2023-2038 goals and specific focus area of growing the Collection's value and significance, meeting the target of 5% increase in value per annum.

Looking ahead, our focus remains on ensuring art is accessible, through thoughtfully designed and well-maintained public artworks, as outlined in the Sunshine Coast Creative Arts Plan. We believe arts participation fosters understanding, unity, and belonging – essential for building a stronger, interconnected community.

This edition of *Latest & Greatest* offers a glimpse into the collecting and acquisitions activity of a public collection, showcasing curatorial concepts (for example: 'She / Her', 'Artful Purpose', 'Spirit Worlds/Other Realms', 'Digital Dimensions' and more!) that have the potential to inspire future exhibitions and touring programs. With such a rich art collection at our disposal, we can unlock endless possibilities for deeper investigations into stories and themes of the past, the now and the future.

The Latest & Greatest III exhibition is a celebration of the creative energy and cultural vibrancy that defines the Sunshine Coast's arts and culture!

Art plants seeds. Stimulates ideas and dreams. Starts conversations.

Art plants seeds. Stimulates ideas and dreams. Starts conversations. And often unexpected ones, at that. Art can open eyes and minds, cross generations in a matter of moments, break down social barriers. It is one of the most effective and enjoyable ways that we may come to understand each other.

Take Todd Fuller's video work: *No use crying over ripped lace* (2023); it was recently acquired by the Caloundra Regional Gallery for the Sunshine Coast Art Collection, as the winner of the Sunshine Coast National Art Prize 2024. *No use crying over ripped lace* recounts an ordinary enough street encounter: Coco, a fabulously attired drag queen, speaks to camera about an attempted gay-bashing on Sydney's Oxford Street. What makes the video outstanding is the confident combination of this direct speech, and the drama unfolding in sequences of lively drawings, transformed into animations, that convey the narrative. This pithy work is modest, attentive, and beautifully paced. The actions of the protagonists are explored through

Coco's memories; her wry, understated account reveals the potential danger of the episode, when a young man's physical safety was threatened, and the quickthinking courage that dealt with this aggression.

This short video work is compassionate, generous but also sophisticated. It is engaging, too: the laconic tone is entirely Australian, as is the wise and funny punchline that provides the title: *No use crying over ripped lace*. The work is topical, and it is timely: it shows how swift action prevented what might have been a terrible outcome from violence on our streets.

We should all take notice. As part of the Collection, Todd Fuller's *No use crying over ripped lace* will be seen in the future by many audiences, in different social settings: not only in the gallery, but in schools, displayed in offices, possibly seen at conferences. Like all works of art, it holds so much cultural potential, waiting to be unleashed.

That artistic potential is carefully nurtured. The Sunshine Coast Art Collection, through its current policy, considers and collects works of art across a wide variety of media that relate to the Sunshine Coast region, that speak of First Nations (Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander) experiences and heritages, that address contemporary ideas and issues. Like Fuller's No use crying over ripped lace, this collection policy looks to works that are of this present moment, as well as works that embody heritage, and therefore memories both individual and collective. This speaks to a sharing of art and ideas, a collective purpose that helps we social beings understand each other more fully, and therefore to build cohesive communities. Art, like sport, is a collective field of action and achievement, that builds innovative and creative thinking in the community, even a sense of shared purpose.

Indeed. But more than that, the wealth of different works found in the Sunshine Coast Art Collection


is deliberately placed in a wide variety of physical and social locations: in the gallery itself, but also in the streets and parks and on the foreshores, and in public buildings and offices. Taking art to the people: this is a generous conception of how art interacts with its community, and it is part of an entire range of cultural activities outlined in the Sunshine Coast Creative Arts Plan. I see this open (open-hearted) approach fostering those unexpected encounters with works of art that jolt us out of our daily routines, that enrich our days, that spike ideas because of moments of surprise.

So I'm all for places like the Sunshine Coast that build our awareness of our places, our communities, our histories, our capacities as social beings. Great art collections are known by their actions, not their locations; they are found in smaller and regional centres, where they are supported by the generosity of local families and the forethought of regional organisations, as much

as in the world's great capitals. And they grow gradually, from seeds planted, nurtured and loved, into powerful expressions of a community's sense of itself, as an active maker of its own world, with an incalculable effect on the lives and futures of people living in the area. From 2006 onwards, the Sunshine Coast's annual art prizes have been contributing to the Collection by acquiring the winning works, but perhaps more importantly, the prize exhibitions have been consistently, and patiently, fostering a sense of commitment to contemporary culture in the region's community, and attracting artists to the area.

The Sunshine Coast's soil is famously fertile. So, it seems, is its cultural life. Isn't that one compelling way to build a richer life, and a better country?






