Using this resource

This teaching and learning resource will focus on ten works from the Latest & Greatest III exhibition. Activities in this resource encourage you to make connections with the Australian Curriculum for Visual Art (version 9.0) by exploring and responding to the artworks and by developing an understanding of relevant practices and skills. Some activities will also require you to create and make artworks or to consider how artworks can be presented.

The following process may be effective:

- 1. Look closely at each artwork. Think about the connections that you can make with it.
- 2. Look at the artist, title, year the work was made, and media.
- 3. Think about the art making processes (how the art materials were used).
- 4. Consider how the work is presented or displayed.
- 5. Attempt the activities provided.

Latest & Greatest III

Latest & Greatest III is an exhibition of the latest works that have been acquired into the Sunshine Coast art collection over the past two years either by acquisition, gifts or donations. It is the third in the Latest & Greatest series and features a range of works by both local and national artists. The exhibition runs from Friday February 7 until Sunday April 6 at Caloundra Regional Gallery.




