Rebate Policy for Infrastructure Charges for Not-for-Profit Organisations



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Purpose of Report

• To seek Council's endorsement of the revised Rebate Policy for Infrastructure Charges for eligible community organisations.



Background

- **2009** Council adopted a policy which allows community organisations to apply for relief from Infrastructure Charges.
- Reduced or removed charges under this policy are considered foregone revenue and as such, are funded from general revenue to acknowledge the contribution made by community organisations providing services to the Sunshine Coast community. (In doing so, retains Council's funding of growth infrastructure capability.)
- Over 12 years and is timely for a review
 - □ Provide clarity
 - □ Direct the rebate where best needed



Current Policy

- Allows a **100% rebate** where the purpose of development is to construct new or extended community service, sporting, recreation or lifesaving facilities.
- Permits a 30% rebate for social, entertainment, gaming or liquor facilities component of the development on basis that some of the profits generated from the commercial operations are directed towards the community, recreation or lifesaving functions of the organisation.
- Applies a rebate of 50% for non-state schools for construction of new or extended educational facilities.
- Allows for religious organisations a 100% rebate for community, youth or meeting facilities available to general community & are non-denominational in their application & use.



Proposed Changes

- Non-State Schools are no longer included as an eligible community organisation. (Ministerial Designations apply.)
- Removal of clubs which are self-funded through commercial operations or liquor licences. (e.g., linked to Nippers' facilities 30%.)
- Recognises organisations registered with the Australian Charities and Not-for-Profits
 Commission as eligible community organisations are to be included. (Not just ATO recognised.)
- Lifesaving Clubs are not identified separately but are now included as community, sporting or recreation organisations.
- Clarity of the operation of the policy and application process, including a standardised application form and a rebate assessment guide.
