We will continue, in 2018, to progress bringing a new international broadband submarine cable to the Sunshine Coast. The cable will transform the Sunshine Coast and broader Queensland economy. It will be a catalyst for technology businesses and high value jobs on the Coast, and has the potential to add \$453 million annually to the Sunshine Coast economy.

reart Expansion moves from design to construction

The principal contractor will take possession of the new airport runway site in early 2018 to start the construction phase. Under the approved Environment Impact Statement the project was forecast to cost \$347 million – Council is very confident the project will be delivered for considerably less than \$347 million and will be operational by Christmas 2020. The new runway will open the Sunshine Coast to other Australian cities, to international markets in Asia and the Western Pacific, and drive significant economic growth.

Working hard for Light Rail

In 2018, council will continue to work hard to achieve State Government funding to deliver a sustainable and effective public transport system – a light rail route – along the coastal strip from the Sunshine Coast Airport south to Maroochydore through Kawana and onto Caloundra and west to Beerwah, so our community can access services and facilities and get to and from their destination easily.

Maroochydore CBD continues to take shape

Construction of the first park and the first section of a striking new waterway will start in 2018. The Aerodrome Road intersection upgrade is expected to be completed late-2018, providing a gateway to the new city centre.

Big boost for sporting facilities

Council will start a \$3.5 million upgrade of the Sunshine Coast Regional Tennis Centre in Caloundra and a \$4 million upgrade to netball and AFL facilities at Maroochydore Multi Sports Complex. Over the next two years \$3.5 million will also go towards sports field upgrades at Meridan Plains.

velcoming the Commonwealth

More than 500 athletes will be training on the Sunshine Coast in preparation for the 2018 Commonwealth Games including Team Saint Helena, Team Scotland, Team Wales, Team Isle of Man, Team Niue and a number of other international athletes.

This is a great opportunity for our community to warmly welcome the visiting athletes, the training staff and their supporters and ensure their stay is productive and fondly remembered.

Protecting our environment for future generations

Improvements to the Sunshine Coast's beaches, expansion of our conservation estates and enhanced river catchments are just some of the benefits that will be delivered with support of Sunshine Coast ratepayers through our Environment Levy.

This program will see \$850,000 invested in coastal rehabilitation activities, \$3.2 million invested in land for environmental conservation and \$945,000 to support community partnerships and grants programs.
