COUNCILLOR COMMENT

It has been drawn to my attention by local residents and tourism providers that the lovey Gardner's Falls, Maleny – a well-known tourism spot in the hinterland is in a very rundown and unmaintained state. Unfortunately, due to its popularity it has become over-loved and as a result a number of incidents have occurred that have caused public safety concern. These activities, coupled with the duel state and local government responsibility; requires that a report come before council to address and manage these issues.

There is public concern that the area is being used for overnight camping, encouraging drinking and resulting in broken bottles and rubbished being left with other waste and left onsite. This situation brings additional concerns with parking and providing a safe entry for emergency vehicles.

As winter is approaching, this is an ideal time to address the issues as there is less public use of the reserve.
