This initiative will be maintained at the 2013/14 allocation of \$1,683,204 and recognised as "Environmental Management Expenses' within this theme.
2	Environment Levy Conservation Estate (Council managed component only) as at April 2016 is 1719ha. The budget allocated includes materials and services and salay/wages associated with any maintenance works. The Environment Levy maintenance program funding will be determined on an annual basis and will consider total size of estate being managed, average maintenance cost and Consumer Price Index (1.7%).
