As the Sunshine Coast population grows and is expected to exceed 500,000 by 2041, we need to plan for the future and secure land to protect natural assets, respond to climatic changes and provide further green spaces for people to enjoy.

These green spaces provide for conservation, flood management, rural production and sport and recreation opportunities. They also provide visual and physical relief from the built environment and enable us to build our resilience for the future.

Where are our major green spaces?

Council is planning and advocating to deliver five major green space areas:

- 1. Blue Heart Sunshine Coast
- 2. The Coast
- 3. Lower Mooloolah River
- 4. Mountain View
- 5. Regional Inter-urban Break.

These major green spaces will be essential in maintaining a healthy environment and liveable Sunshine Coast.
