

GENERAL NOTES

- Community consultation finalised February 2015
- Additional to capital works funding pursue grant funding for the following items Future amenities building Play and learning elements

Refer to internal stakeholder feedback during all design development phases

- All Abilities Playground to include:
 As much as is practical, all elements to be accessible including amenities building
 and park furniture (seating, BBQ)s, waste bins, water fountain)
 Play elements to cater to social play, emotional play, hysical play and cognitive play
 Design development to consider barcode reader facilities to enable site
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navigation through a mobile phone application

- Signage to include: General signage including raised tactile and braille formats
- Child language (pictorial cues, sign language) Chat boards, activity choice panels
- Safety, operational, liability signage
- Retain and protect existing trees, enhance environment to promote general health of trees

Due to lack of records it can not be assumed that the site has been investigated and cleared of unexploded ordinances (UXO). For Workplace Health & Safety UXO clearing prior to any construction work is required.

ELEMENTS TO BE CONSIDERED FOR CONSTRUCTION IN THE

- 2015/2016 FINANCIAL YEAR Construction of the following items will occur as budget allows, budget to be confirmed
- 601 Formalised car parking to include standard and disabled bays, bus bay and connecting footpath to AS2890.6. Twenty (20) trees to be planted to offset the removal of three (3) existing trees
- 02 Realignment of the cricket field fence and installation of park seats to provide shaded seating for dog off-leash and cricket facility users

03 Flying fox to new playground area

- ELEMENTS PROPOSED FOR FUTURE CONSTRUCTION
- Construction of the following items will occur according to priorities (yet to be determined) and as budget allows Proposed amenities building, configuration to include a unisex accessible cubicle
- Area to be aerated, top dressed and fertilised
- Proposed main entry point with a fun and exciting entry feature and planting to assist safe entry
- Proposed shelter with two accessible picnic table settings and accessible double electric barbeque, furniture to provide for a range of different heights and abilities
- noposed shelter with accessible double electric barbeque
- Review car parking to Ilya Street and Croydon Avenue for compliance with Australian Standards, 1 maintenance requirements and tree protection
- Investigate future extension to car parking facilities along Croydon Avenue
- Proposed 2m wide pedestrian concrete path loop and connection to secondary pedestrian access gate to include a sensory walk with stimulating elements to engage the park user on an adventure. Path to avoid ponding and allow for overland flow of storm water 0
- Proposed grassy knolls to be mowable with maximum grade of 1:6 and a flat top to avoid scouring
- Proposed pedestrian path to be constructed by others
- Proposed drainage feature to include subsurface drainage, large format boulders and planting to facilitate both drainage of storm water and nature play. Park storm water management to include grass swales and sub-surface drainage
- Basketball court proposed to be reconfigured as a 'multi-court' facility with the provision of line marking, hoops and goals for various games i.e. football, basketball and handball
- Proposed 'Natural Play' area with equal access to the maximum number of elements. Elements may include: sand play, water play, log scramble, steppers, balance beams, raised planters with herbs, talk/sound tubes, musical instruments, activity panels, tactile elements, dome element for 10 role play and quiet time
- Proposed expansion of recently built playground, integration of the existing playground equipment and shade sail within an extended playground facility, with provision for a range of ages and abilite Playground to reside within a landscaped setting with connections to the adjoining multi-court facilit and bike track. Surface finish to be 100% wet pour rubber sottfall. Possible elements may include: flying fox, fort, swings, spring toys, slide
- Proposed park furniture to include seating platforms, park benches, park seats, bin surrounds
- Proposed Moreton Bay Fig feature tree. Remove segments of learn to ride facility to allow for plant bed. Cultivate and improve planting bed soil to 1m, provide 12m diameter mound to 1m high at ape Refer to advice from council arborist
- Opposed drinking fountain

ELEMENTS TO BE DECOMMISSIONED

- (2) Existing pedestrian path to be decommissioned prior to construction of new path, see #11 Tor the safety of park users, Council will amend the current Local Law to restrict dog access from the fenced All Abilities play area
- Existing playground fencing to be decommissioned following completion of perimeter fencing to

- Existing amenities building to be retained and upgraded to comply with current access and mobility standards, refer to report from Architecture & Access, April 2015. Upon end of the cycle, or subject to State or Federal grant funding, amenities building to be decommissioned. Propose to investigate extending current covered area to increase capacity for spectator shelter, include fixed outdoor sea
- 600 Existing fencing to cricket ground to be retained with realignment to allow for shaded seating area
- OPedestrian entry gate Maintenance access gate (3.6m wide) with removable bollards where necessary, also to provide access for emergency services vehicles
- is Existing shelters with picnic table settings and waste bins to be retained
- Existing bike track to be retained, proposed ground cover planting and improvements to the soil structure to promote vigorous tree growth. Proposed creation of 'Park & Play' pit stops around the route incorporating themed play items i.e. a garage, a bus stop, play panels and
